

HANCOCK COUNTY HOME SEWAGE TREATMENT SYSTEM ASSISTANCE

Does Your Property Have a Failing Sewer System?

SEWAGE SYSTEM REPLACEMENT FUNDS AVAILABLE!

Assistance is available to income-eligible homeowners to repair or replace their home sewage treatment system. Assistance covers either 100% or 85% of the cost based on annual income and number of people in the household. Coverage includes cost of labor, permits, design, and materials to install the sewer system and to abandon the old septic system. Households will be assisted on a first come first serve basis until all funds have been expended.

In order to qualify for assistance:

- The applicant must own and live in the home as their primary residence. (Rental properties are not eligible)
- The applicant must meet or be below the Poverty Limits for the number of people living in the residence.

All household members over 18 years of age must submit income documentation.

Verifications Needed with application:

- # **Employment** Copies of four (4) weeks= pay stubs reflecting year-to-date totals and signed Employment Verification form. If you need additional forms, please make copies or call to request forms.
- # **Fixed Income** Unemployment, Social Security, Disability, SSI, Child Support, Pension, etc.
A statement from the agency verifying the amount of monthly income received.
- # **Self-Employment** A copy of last year's Federal filed income taxes, including Profit and Loss Statement.
- # **Interest Income** – A copy of bank statement reflecting the amount of interest earned last year.
